



Fact Sheet: Mansfield District

About Rumpke's Mansfield District

- The Mansfield District consists of the Noble Road Landfill, the Richland County Recycling & Transfer Facility and the Mansfield Hauling Operation.
- Rumpke employs nearly 100 people in its Mansfield District. This includes truck drivers, laborers, mechanics, sales representatives, office staff and management.
- Rumpke has about 60 trucks in its Mansfield District fleet.
- Rumpke has operated its Mansfield District since August 2009.

Noble Road Landfill

- The Noble Road Landfill is located about 15 miles north of Mansfield in Shiloh, Ohio. It is a municipal solid waste facility that accepts non-hazardous trash.
- The landfill opened in 1997 and was sold later that year. Allied Waste purchased the site in 2000, and Rumpke acquired the facility in August 2009.
- The entire facility takes up about 288 acres of land, of which 101 are permitted for waste disposal.
- At its peak, the landfill is 1,282 feet above sea level.
- Daily, the landfill is permitted to accept 4,000 tons of municipal solid waste and 2,000 tons of exempt waste. In 2009, the site averaged 1,750 tons per day.
- The Noble Road Landfill sits adjacent to Fowler Woods State Nature Preserve, a 187-acre protected woodlands known for its spring wildflowers and walking trail (pictured at right). The swampy areas of the preserve are inhabited by amphibians, including the woodland salamander.
- The site is regularly inspected by the following agencies to ensure environmental compliance: Richland County Health Department, Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and internally by Rumpke.
- Special liners are installed under all the waste in the landfill to protect the environment and ensure containment. The liners include a layer of re-compacted clay, a high-density polyethylene (HDPE) plastic sheet and a drainage layer. The liners are reviewed, approved and inspected by Ohio EPA.
- A series of pipes and pumps remove leachate (any liquid in contact with trash) from the landfill, and it is transported to the Shelby Waste Water Treatment Plant.
- Groundwater monitoring wells are located throughout the site to monitor groundwater quality.
